“Senses Sleuths-Let’s Hunt for Bluey”

This is a whole day programme is designed to immerse Prep students in a scientific quest to track down “Bluey,” our missing blue tongue lizard.

In searching, students will be using their sense to follow Blueys’ journey through Columboola bush land, whilst learning about the basic living needs of some of the plants and animals that call Columboola home.

At the end of the day, students get up close and personal with live animals, and discuss how their external features, and their behaviours help them to survive in their environments.
